This position involves the handling of litigation involving the County or Constitutional Officers including but not limited to cases in one or more of the following areas: torts; employment; construction; real estate-related matters; inverse condemnation or eminent domain; and other civil and administrative litigation as assigned.

## **Qualifications**

The ideal candidate will have significant first chair trial experience in a range of types of cases and venues, on behalf of a Florida local government. Minimum qualifications include admission to, and good standing with, the Florida Bar; and 1-4 years of litigation experience for Assistant County Attorney 1 (\$60,174 - \$96,283), or 5 years of litigation experience for Assistant County Attorney 2 (\$93,454 - \$149,510). Board Certification in an applicable area is preferred.
